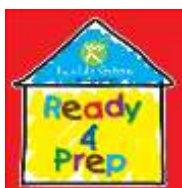
Curriculum Day – Friday 11th August. Students **DO NOT** come to school on **this day**. The teachers will be involved in a range of professional development activities.

Grade 2D information report Recycling

Classification:

Recycling is using old materials and making new things with it such as, using icy pole sticks and coffee cups to make a pushcart.

Why do we recycle?

We recycle to save energy. Did you know that Americans waste 725 Kilograms of waste every year! Recycling saves the wildlife because if there was rubbish in the ocean the fish will be caught in it and possibly die.



How can you recycle?

You can recycle by using your old items and making them into something new. You can recycle by putting your rubbish in the right bins. Plastic like dip and crackers snack, plastic wrap and snap lock bags should go in the plastic bin. Paper like schoolwork and scrap paper should go in the recycling/ paper bin. Food like fruit, vegetables and sandwich crust should go in the food bin. Foil like chip packets and foil wrap should go in the foil bin.



Why do we need to put bottles and paper in the right bins?

Each material makes different items. Plastic bottles are made into benches at the shopping centre, playground equipment, rakes and new bottles or containers. Paper can be reused in craft time. We hope this information helps you to start recycling. **Recycling is good for the Earth because it helps us protect the environment.**

Science Talent Search Judging Day

Congratulations to thirty students from Grade 4 to 6 who presented their projects on Saturday at Kew or Preston. Science Talent Search is an annual science competition run by the Victorian Science Teachers' Association for students from Prep to Year 12.

There are nine sections in which the students can use to present their research. The students entered all sections except games. First timers, Debby Oladiji and Anna Thot, chose photography and focussed on tree bark. The judges congratulated the girls on their excellent research and their eye-catching presentation. Pooja Pippalla and Lakshethaa Rajan, both entering for the second time, also chose to photograph fruit bats and the judges were blown away by their knowledge and passion for the topic. Bokthiyar and Aala chose photography to share how their amazing dads grow the family vegetables in the back yard. Pooja Don Manuvelge Don and Vrishti Reddy invented a Boat-Car which the judges said was an "excellent use of readily available materials to construct a solution to a real life problem." Ali Shahed and Gunjeet Singh invented a Water Wheel to remove litter and the judges were impressed with their knowledge of scientific method and refining the design by lots of trial and error. Jayda H and Plaj Andrew built a model of a catchment and demonstrated to the judges how litter all ends up in Port Phillip Bay. Claudia Cardosa and Megan Frost explained in their poster how to build a healthy and productive cities and the judges were fascinated by their beautifully presented poster with eight key areas of focus.
