Science Happenings

Dr Aditi Sriram visits our school

The Science Captains, Amina and Milica, welcomed Dr Aditi Sriram to our school. Dr Sriram spoke to the grade 5 and 6 students about her work as a veterinary surgeon. She presented a slide show that outlined her work from small animals to large zoo animals.

She told the students of the procedures necessary when working with large, dangerous animals. Her three month research visit to 600 ha Enderby Island, 650 kilometres south of the South Island of New Zealand was a highlight of the talk. Students learnt about the importance the New Zealand Government places on caring for the New



Zealand sea lions, albatrosses and yellow eyed penguins. Dr Sriram answered many questions from the students and staff.

Kids Teaching Kids Conference

On Friday the five Science Captains, Behyad, Jake, Lakshethaa, Milica and Amina, attended the regional Kids Teaching Kids Conference hosted by Silverton Primary. Eight local schools, 150 students from grade 4 to 10, participated in the 14 workshops ranging from propagation methods to making bee hotels. The Science Captains presented a workshop on the incidents of foaming in Dandenong Creeks over the past decades. Amina and Milica were impressed with the food at recess



and lunch and Behyad and Jake thought the opening performance by the Silverton band and dance troupe was outstanding. The

students said that the information and explanations were very clear and the activities were also fun to do.
